"The Atomic Bomb saved my Life"

N THE 17th August, in the year of 1945, this year's Royal Albert Hall Easter Guest Speaker, the Rev. John Thiessen (pronounced Teesen), was due for execution. He was given his last meal, and



was prepared for death. It was a Japanese prison, and he had been taken there from a concentration camp. During the last war, when living in the Far East, he helped thousands of people in concentration camps by secretly supplying them with food and medicine, but was discovered and sentenced to death. It was at the crucial moment when he was due to die, that the first atomic bomb was exploded over a Japanese city. "The atomic bomb saved my life," Mr. Thiessen told us. Certain is this fact, that God had His hand upon His servant. During the last few years he has toured continental countries preaching to many thousands; newspaper reports during this period described him as "The Billy Graham of Germany" and "The Panzer Division of God."

Mr. Thiessen's life has been in keeping with his character. Perhaps it would be more correct to say that the exciting life he has followed has been the result of his attitude to life. Forceful, courageous, a man who believes in getting on with the job on hand irrespective of the risk it involves. Not content to remain in prison, even though the Japanese were adroit at keeping their prisoners, John Thiessen found a way of escape to freedom. However, he did not run away from danger but continued his missionary work. Soon the war ended, but the aftermath was revolution in Asia, and within the short space of three months more than ten thousand Europeans were killed by the Asiatics. The Lord preserved His servant once more, although he faced death on repeated occasions evacuating Christians to safety. One night he was able to rescue 150 people from certain death when the city of Bandung was attacked by Communists.

His friends have learned not to be surprised by any of his adventurous exploits. This man who was described in his

youth, as he roamed the uncivilised parts of Indonesia, "The Jungle Missionary." This tough, powerful missionary-evangelist, comes to London with a burning desire in his heart: "I have one goal before me, to serve God and to glorify Jesus Christ only, through the mighty blessings of the Holy Spirit."

So much for the public life of the man who has drawn 30,000 Germans at a time to hear the Gospel message, and preached to the "Man-eaters" of Dutch New Guinea.

Mr. Thiessen is an ex-student of the Elim Bible College. He has been a missionary in Indonesia for twenty-eight years, where he was born. His father was a great pioneer of this mission field, and at the birth of John Thiessen two of his father's converts, Maharajas, signed his birth certificate. He is married

and the proud father of four sons, the youngest being nineteen years of age. He is resident in the United States of America at the present time, but travels extensively preaching the Gospel in many countries.

A dynamic preacher who has attracted the nonchurch-goer to his meetings in the thousands, particularly youth. His last trip to the continent was at the invitation of the Evangelical Youth of Germany, when large numbers were won to Christ through his virile presentation of Christ.

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THE TABERNACLE IN THE WILDERNESS

IV.-THE BRAZEN LAVER (Exod. 30: 17-21).

HERE IS THE NEXT STEP in the march Godward. The laver with its clean water stood in the pathway of all who "would go on." The brazen altar emphasises the Gospel truth of Justification through the blood of Christ; the laver stresses that great truth and experience which follows justification, namely, sanctification, that "Holiness without which no man can see the Lord" (Heb. 12:14).

1. THE NEED FOR THE LAVER.

The need for the layer was established by the ease by which both priests and people could be defiled in the wilderness. Actually, the priests were the only ones allowed to use the laver. When they were first consecrated they were stripped of their garments, totally immersed and then clothed in the snowy garb of their calling (Lev. 6). Paul in Titus 3:5 uses an expressive term: "... according to His mercy He saved us by the washing of regeneration." Here he suggests the total immersion of the priests to be symbolical of regeneration from which sanctification springs. But the priests, typical of the believer, although once totally immersed, needed to wash hands and feet daily as they served the Lord in the Outer Court (cp. John 13: 8: "He that is bathed needeth not but to wash his feet . , ."). We are called upon as believer priests to judge ourselves daily (1 Cor. 11:31). We must examine ourselves. How prone we are to judge others; how loath to judge ourselves. How quick to search our brother's life and how slow to search our own,

The laver was a great mirror. It was made of the molten looking-glasses of the women (Fxod. 38:8). In the limpid waters the priests could see themselves truly reflected. The Word of God which testifies to cleansing, and which is itself an instrument of cleansing (Eph. 5:26), shows us our true state before God and, in addition, what we should be. A black man once saw himself in a glass. It was the first time, and he would not believe that the ugly person he saw was himself. In anger he smashed the glass. We smile at his foolishness, but are we not equally foolish when we rebel as a faithful preacher holds up the mirror of God's Word and shows us ourselves?

"Could'st thou in vision see thyself the man God meant."

Then never more would'st thou be the man thou art content."

Notice, no measurements are given. Sanctification is not a fixed, rigid state which admits of no further development. Christian perfection, which is a stage in the process of sanctification (Phil. 3:15, cp. 12), admits of a further development. A "perfection" which admits of no further growth, apprehension of God and development of character is, by the very nature of things, imperfect. There will always be in the spiritual life deeper crucifixions, more triumphant resurrections, and more glorious ascensions. The laver is measureless!

2. NOW OBSERVE THE CLEANSING.

The water held by the laver is typical of the cleansing which comes through the Word. We cannot stress sufficiently the power of the Word in practical sanctification (Psa. 119:9; John 17:17; Eph. 5:27).

Cleansing is a personal responsibility. "Aaron and his sons shall wash their hands" (Exod. 30: 19). It is also our responsibility as believers, to allow the Word to deal with habit and action. Advocates of one particular teaching of holiness emphasise so beavily the Divine provision of sanctification—"I the Lord do sanctify you"—that they fail to see the human responsibility expressed in the words, "sanctify yourselves." Balance must be preserved with the teaching of holiness as every other teaching. No scripture is of private interpretation here as elsewhere, but all must be brought in line with the sum total of relevant truth.

Cleansing is a daily, a continuous business (Exod. 30: 20-22). Every day as the priests drew near to the altar to offer the burnt offering they had to cleanse themselves. Sanctification is not one single fixed experience and act. It is indeed one positional act in that it springs out of, and is associated with, regeneration (1 Pet. 1: 2), but practically it is a daily and continuous progression. "If we walk in the light... the blood... cleanseth" (1 John 1: 7). The

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The Rightful Universal King



In spite of all that has happened and may yet take place in the world, there is a day marked in the calendar of God when The Rightful Universal King will rule over the whole earth. That will be the day when the "King of Kings and Lord of Lords" takes over the kingdoms of the world, for He alone is its rightful king. The truth of this is set forth in Revelation 6:1, 2: "And I saw in the right hand of Him that sat on the throne a book written within and on the backside, sealed with seven seals. And I saw a strong angel proclaiming with a loud voice, Who is worthy to open the book, and to loose the seals thereof?" (Rev. 5:1, 2). John watched intently, but to his consternation and distress no one came forward to take the book out of the hand of the One upon the throne. John must have realised the significance of this and feared the consequence of the book remaining sealed, for he wept profusely. An elder comforted and reassured him, stating that the Lion of Juda, the Root of David, bath prevailed to open the book (v. 5). Christ the overcomer was found worthy to open the book. The word "overcome" suggests that He had been engaged in some great conflict and had overcome the opposition, and was thus qualified to open the book. What is meant by the Lord Jesus taking hold of the sealed book prior to the breaking of the seals? A clue to, and an illustration of, the meaning may be found in Jeremiah, chapter thirty-two. God informed Jeremiah that his cousin Hanameel would ask him to purchase the right of redemption of a field he owned. On God's instruction Jeremiah bought it and had the transaction witnessed. Two scrolls (deeds) were used, and Jeremiah as evidence of the purchase gave them into the safe keeping of Baruch his trusted friend. When property was purchased the deed to the new owner was duplicated, so that there was an open and a sealed copy. The sealed copy became the possession of the new purchaser as his evidence of ownership, but the open copy was for any one to read. The new owner's name was inscribed upon both copies. In the case of a dispute over any estate, the person considered by the authorities to be the rightful owner would be given the sealed document or scroll-like deed to open. He would break the seals and opening the deed would prove by its contents that he was entitled to the estate. As the only legally qualified one, Jesus took the sealed scroll to open it by breaking the seals. The contents of the scroll have to do with events on the earth, prior to Christ's coming to take possession of the kingdoms of the world. He being the only one found worthy to open the book evidenced His rightful kingship over the earth.

The Lord will come as The Rightful Universal King to the earth to defeat the armies of Antichrist and set up His kingdom, over which He will reign for one thousand years. This crushing defeat of the forces of evil will take place at Megiddo on the edge of the great plain of Esdraelon in Palestine, or, as the Hebrew puts it. "to the place which is called Harmageddon " (Armageddon-Judges 5:19, 20; 2 Kings 23:29). "In that day shall the Lord defend the inhabitants of Jerusalem" (Zech. 12:8, 9), and according to Isaiah He will come by way of Bozrah and will deal with the armies of Antichrist as He moves along (Isa. 63:1-4). At the supreme moment of crisis for the Jews He will reach them, and on that day His feet shall stand on the Mount of Olives. Then a wonderful thing will happen; "... and the Mount of Olives shall cleave in the midst thereof toward the east, and toward the west, and there shall be a great valley; and half of the mountain shall remove toward the north and half of it toward the south" (Zech. 14:4). A number of nations taking part in this final battle are referred to in Ezckiel 38 and 39. Most expositors advocate that Russia will be the chief nation of a northern confederacy that will invade Palestine, Russia being represented by "Gog, the land of Magog, the chief prince of Meshech and Tubal" (Ezek. 38:2). Allied with Russia will be Persia, Ethiopia, Libya, Togarmah (Turkey) and Gomer (Germany). The "kings of the east" will also fight there (Rev. 16:12). However, regarding the identity of all these nations one cannot dogmatise. One thing is certain, whoever these nations are, they will be defeated utterly by The Rightful Universal King. Until He comes to reign there will always be, more or less, misunderstanding, misrule, disappointment and trouble among the nations of the earth, but on that day all this will give place to His glorious reign.

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HASTINGS REVIVAL CAMPAIGN

It was a mild January afternoon when a number of us started off with Pastor Gordon Wright for Pastor Ken Matthew and Party's Revival Campaign in Hastings. Already a coach party from Eastbourne church had been to the first meeting of the campaign and had brought back a stirring report of over forty decisions for Christ on the very first night. Down the steep streets of Hastings we hastened our steps to the famous White Rock Pavilion. Inside the lovely large auditorium people were pressing in and filling up the seats in a quiet reverent manner. From the platform one was amazed at the sea of eagerly upturned faces. The campaign was only four days old. yet this afternoon service was vibrant with expectation and power. Pastor Matthew made the atmosphere homely by chatting to his audience, telling them of three people on the platform who would give short testimonies of healing. Miss Jardine held the attention of the hearers by clearly and concisely telling them of how God healed her from four dread diseases. "Hello everybody," breezily called out Dr. Myron Sackett of America as he beamingly announced healing from diabetes last year, for which previously he had been receiving daily injections of insulin.

My testimony said Pastor F. Hodge, Clapham, is to tell you that my small son, up there in the gallery, was healed of a dreadful eczema covering his body, in one of Pastor Matthew's earlier campaigns in the city of Leeds.

From John's Gospel, chapter five, Rev. William Wood of the London Healing Mission, read of the incident at the Bethesda Pool, and from this Pastor Matthew declared in a convincingly solemn and searching manner that sin was the root cause of all the world's misery, including the plight of suffering around the Bethesda Pool. One wondered how Hastings people would react to the preacher's scathing skill in revealing sin's devastating power and Jesus as the only remedy. Only one straight from the shoulder appeal, then in the tense silence following about eighty hands shot up, and down to the platform the people came, and solemnly before us all prayed aloud together pleading for forgiveness and yielding their lives to God.

During the healing at the close several were

touched in body and some definite cases were borne witness to later in the evening service.

The following report is from the Evening Argus, 2nd Feb.:

A LOCKED ARM MOVES; A LIMP VANISHES

"In an atmosphere of reverence, without excitement or great emotional stress, many people have been healed at the public revival and divine healing campaign led by the Rev. Ken Matthew at the White Rock Pavilion, Hastings.

"Hundreds of people have attended nightly to hear Mr. Matthew preach the Gospel with sincerity and simplicity. He

states that the object of his addresses has been to persuade men and women 'to receive the Lord Jesus Christ as their personal Saviour.'

"With the Rev. Eldin Corsie, a pianist of exceptional ability, and the enthusiastic song-leading of the Rev. Richard Lighton, the congregation at each service have sung hymns and choruses with great fervour.

"Towards the end of the service, the sick and afflicted have been invited to come forward for prayer. Mr. Matthew explains that he has been commissioned to preach the Gospel and consequently must pray for sick people to be healed. He points out the teaching of the Bible: 'Go ye into all the world and preach the gospel . . . lay hands on the sick and they shall recover.' In the quiet, reverent atmosphere, Mr. Matthew lays hands on the sick and many have been healed. A woman with a locked head and shoulders was cured. Another woman with a locked arm was able to lift it and move it quite freely. A man who walked forward with obvious difficulty was instantly healed and able to return to his seat without a limp. A woman testified at one service that she had suffered for thirty years from a painful throat swelling. But the moment she was prayed for she was immediately healed. A man said he had been healed during the service while the sermon was being preached. Others have confirmed that they have been cured of internal disorders.

"Mr. Matthew told the congregation that he believed in Divine Healing because it is taught in the Scriptures. He said that he himself had been miraculously healed of infantile paralysis.

"Tonight and tomorrow the team led by Mr. Matthew are to be joined by Mr. Geoffrey Cooper at the Hammond organ.

"Tomorrow at 8 p.m. there will be an after-church rally at which Mr. Matthew is to give a prophetic lecture on 'Russia versus Israel'."

ONCE EVERY YEAR some members of our family used to come to our home for a little reunion party. We naturally enjoyed ourselves and invariably had a game of cricket on the lawn with the children, a favourite uncle always taking a prominent part in the proceedings. One year, however, there was a vacant chair at the tea-table. Uncle had passed on to be with the Lord. Although we still had a bappy time together we could not forget one who was with us at the last reunion. He was indeed missed, because his scat was empty.

One sometimes reads this verse in the "In Memoriam" column of our newspapers:

"If you have a Mother
Cherish her with care;
You'll never know how much you'll miss her
Until you see the vacant chair."

How true this often is! There are folk and things that will not be valued correctly until they are missing. The war proved this to be so. So do the events of our lives.

On one occasion we had the plumber in our home all day, and how we missed the water supply! We certainly had taken our modern facilities for granted. When deprived of them even for a few hours we soon learned something of their true worth. The old adage "You never miss the water until the well runs dry" is still very true. And what is true of things is also true uf persons, which brings us to our text: "Thou shalt be missed, because thy seat will be empty." Let us consider—

1. AN EMPTY SEAT BECAUSE OF JEALOUSY AND HATRED (1 Sam. 20; 18).

King Saul had disobeyed God's commands. He had failed to reach the high standard God had set for His king. In consequence, God had rejected Saul and had elected David to be king in his place. Now Jonathan was the king's son, and therefore heir to the throne, while David was but a commoner. the son of Jesse the Bethlehemite. The fact of his disobedience and its judgment by God, the knowledge of God's project concerning David, and his bitter envy of the young man, had evoked Saul's cruel jealousy and bitter hatred, "And Saul eved David from that day forward." Intent on mischief Saul had invited David to reside at the palace and to take his meals at the royal table. The tension between Saul and David increased almost daily until it became unbearable, and noticeable by all in the court. A crisis threatened and shortly came to a

head. Jonathan, who loved David, realised that his father meant ill toward his friend, and discerned that his life was in jeopardy, so in order to save him, and to prove conclusively that Saul meant to dispose of him he suggested that David should absent himself from the palace, for he knew that Saul would soon notice his absence from the royal table, and his reaction would clearly indicate what lay in his father's heart where David was concerned. How well the scheme worked! How black Saul's heart proved to be, for from that moment Saul tried his utmost to slay his rival to the throne! David's place was empty. Yes, he was missed, because his seat was empty. A vacant chair because of jealousy and hatred.

The spirit of Saul is still in the world today. How many Davids are missing from the Saviour-King's table, compelled to hide in the caves of the rocks or to wander in the wilderness alone, because of the jealousy and bitterness of the Sauls?

Jesus was seated with His disciples around the table. It was the Last Supper. He had talked about His imminent decease and of how it would be brought about. "One of you shall betray Me." "Then the disciples looked one on another, doubting of whom He spake." They had not long to wait to be informed on this matter, for Jesus identified His betrayer by handing him the sop. The man was Judas. From that moment Satan entered into Judas and he went out immediately on his fateful mission of ill will. There was an empty seat at the Lord's table. Judas was missing. He was perpetrating an act of grossest treachery!

Are there not some in the midst of the Church, perhaps even seated at the Lord's table, who are at this moment considering betraying their Lord and Master; those who, when the wrong spirit motivates them, will sell the Christ for the modern equivalent of thirty pieces of silver? Unless they repent they

will be missed, for their seats will be empty because of treachery.

3. AN EMPTY SEAT BECAUSE OF NEGLECT.

The Bible shows us that God has a seat and that He is in His place: "God sitteth upon the throne," we are told in Psalms and Revelation. The Lord Jesus Christ also has a seat and He, too, is on His throne. He is "set on the right hand of the Majesty in the heavens" (Heb. 8:1). Satan likewise has a seat, and he certainly is where his seat is. Our world and our times bear testimony to this fact only too tragically.

You, too, have a seat. "Where?" you may ask. In any church, chapel, or hall, where Jesus is faithfully preached, and where the saints meet together for praise, worship and service. Is your seat occupied? Once you had a seat among the scornful (Psa. 1:1); now you have a seat among the saints. Can you be relied upon to be in your seat at the Communion service, the Prayer meeting, the Bible study? Are



you in your place when the Gospel is preached so faithfully by that servant of God, praying that the Word of the Lord may have free course, and be glorified? Does your minister, when he looks out over his congregation, as he stands in his pulpit, miss you because your seat is empty? If he misses you, how much more does your Lord and Master? Are jealousy, bitterness, strife, treachery, selfish pleasure, indolence or negligence, responsible for your absence from your seat in God's house? Is any one of these a sufficient reason or a legitimate excuse for such a serious omission? Surely it is more important for you to be where you should be, than where you want to be or could be! What a help your presence and prayers can be when you are in your seat. Too many of God's children are present in spirit when they should be present in body!

The elder brother was missing from the feast the loving father had prepared in celebration of the prodigal son's return. Can it be that there are those among the Lord's children who also are affronted by the return of, reception for, and rejoicing over the modern repentant prodigal?

4. AN EMPTY SEAT BECAUSE OF REJECTION

(Matt. 8:13; 22:9-13; Rev. 19:7-9.).

A great day is coming, the day of the marriage supper of the Lamb. From all parts of the world, and from the realm of the blesséd dead in Christ, will the redeemed gather to the heavenly venue to take part in the marriage feast. The Bridegroom, the Lord Jesus Christ, will be there. The Bride, the Church, will be there. Angels from the realms of glory will be there. What a time of reunion and rejoicing! How blessed will be those who are called to that supper, who during this life decided for Christ. What rapture will be theirs.

When invitations to a wedding are sent out in the realm of society, the letters R.S.V.P. (please reply) are to be found in one corner of the card. As a mark of breeding and courtesy one accedes to this request. So it is in the realm of the Spirit. God has sent out to the world of mankind a universal invitation to all men everywhere to attend the marriage of His dear Son, "God so loved the world, that He gave . . ." "Whosoever will may come." Yes, the invitation is a loving one, and for all! You are invited, a seat has been reserved for you. Will you be there? It rests now with you. But suppose you are not in your place? Undoubtedly you will be missed: someone may look for you; someone may be disappointed. As in society, so in the Spirit. You can ignore the invitation. You can reject it. You can be too husy at the present time to answer it, putting it aside until a more convenient time. But, be it remembered, one thing is certain; there will never come another invitation from God, for "God . . . hath in these last days spoken unto us by His Son." In the message of the cross of Christ is God's full and final invitation to all men. "Whosoever believeth" shall be saved. We must believe, respond. and receive. To be saved is to be sure of a scat at the table of the Lamb in heaven on that glorious day.

Time is rapidly passing by. Today is the day of salvation, not tomorrow. Can you afford not to be present in that Day? When that day arrives, an eternal day will dawn. The day of opportunity will for ever be over; the day of realisation will have arrived. There will be no second chance of accepting God's offer, no coming on later. You must make your decision now. Will you then accept this loving invitation? Will you now reply to God in the words so many have used in their response: "O Lamb of God, I come, I come! Then when the great call comes you will be ready, with your wedding garment on, ready to take your place at the feast in honour of Him "who loved us, and gave Himself for us."

Now, if ever, would appear to be the time for someone to shed scriptural light on the muddled world scene.

Why Nasser is Cocky

President Nasser of Egypt turns down all Allied efforts to internationalise the Suez Canal, with gay contempt. If he were shrugging off the impressive power of Britain and France, with an incidental slight of United States influence, it would be remarkable, for Egypt is hardly a fourth or fifth-rate power, and is extremely vulnerable so far as a potential attack from Western Europe. It is obvious that the real power behind the scenes is Communist Russia, and some shrewd commentators believe that the new strong man, Shepilov, is the author of the recently emerging Egyptian policy.

light reveals and the blood, brought to bare upon us by the Spirit and the Word, cleanses.

Cleansing is necessary for fellowship and service. We noticed previously that the priests were dipped when they were consecrated (Exod. 29:4) and that this corresponded with regeneration. It was never repeated for we can only be regenerated once. But here the hands and feet had to be cleansed. The same thought is brought out in John 13: 2-10. The reply of the Saviour when Peter protested is significant, and when he agreed and asked to be completely washed, is more significant: "He that is washed (bathed) needeth not save to wash his feet but is clean every whit . . ." Schofield notes that the reference is an eastern one of a person newly come from the public bath. His feet alone, defiled by the walk through the street, would require fresh cleansing. We also have been to the great hath of Christ's precious blood which has dealt effectively with our stain and guilt, but we need the continual cleansing from defilement.

Numbers 19: 11-16, shows how easy an Israelite could be defiled in the wilderness. He had only to touch a grave, a bone, another unclean person, and defilement was contracted. It is the same with ourselves, and we lose the joy of fellowship with Him. The washing at the laver removes the defilement and restores the fellowship. It seems a strange thing that the priests, who ministered about holy things continually, were the ones who needed the cleansing. One would have thought their preoccupation with the clean and holy things would have obviated the necessity of continual cleansing. Be that as it may, there is surely a suggestive thought here for all preachers especially? Do we not need to keep our hands clean if we are going to wax stronger and stronger. Ought we not to cleanse our walk though we are continually ministering Christ unto others?

3. THE LAVER SPEAKS OF CHRIST

Like almost every article in the Tabernacle, the laver speaks of Christ. He is our wisdom, righteousness, sauctification and redemption (1 Cor. 1:30). Observe the water for cleansing was taken from the side of the laver. In this connection John 19:34 is deply illuminating. "There came out"—as a result of the piercing of our Redeemer's side—"blood and water." Justification and sanctification come to us from the one great and wounded Saviour. All our need for full redemption is found in this Christ of infinite fulness. Notice 1 John 5:8: "There are three which bear witness in earth, the Spirit, and the

"His thoughts troubled him" (v. 6).

Conscience is a tremendous force and often "Makes cowards of us all." Belshazzar could not read the writing on the wall, yet was smitten with fear by its possible message. His conscience told him it could mean no good thing. If right with God, we will neither fear that which is revealed, nor that which God has concealed.

TUESDAY, February 26th. Daniel 5: 10-16.

"O king, live for ever" (v. 10),

The queen's words have an ironic sound. Before that night was over, the king was slain. None can hoast such idle words, or of "Goods laid up for many years," nor say "We will go into such a city and tarry there a year." Let us ever remember to say "If the Lord will,"

WEDNESDAY, February 27th. Daniel 5: 17-31, "Thou his son, O Belshazzar" (v. 22).

Belshazzar inherited more than a kingdom from his father; he inherited his father's pride, with even more disastrous results. Nebuchadnezzar repented, but possibly too late to train his son in ways of humility. As it is often "Like father, like son," let parents seek above all things to bequeath a legacy of godly example and training.

THURSDAY, February 28th. Daniel 6: 1-14.

"An excellent spirit was in him" (v. 3),

Daniel possessed a quality so difficult to describe, but so easy to discern. The prophet did not lack in personality or ability, but had something much finer-he had character. This excellency is expressed in the words "He was faithful" (v. 4),

> "To thine own self he true. For then must follow as night the day, Thou cans: not then to any man be false,"

FRIDAY, March 1st. Daniel 6: 15-28.

"He believed in his God" (v. 23).

His faith in God, and faithfulness to Him, did not save Daniel from persecution and trials, but they brought him through them all in triumph, and to still greater honours. The earnest believer may have to endure rather than escape trials, but all is well, for "The God who shut the lions" mouths is just the same today."

SATURDAY, Murch 2nd. Daniel 9: 1-15.

"I prayed unto the Lord my God" (v. 4).

"Daniel was a man of prayer," the children's chorus says, and how true. He prayed with others (chap. 2). He prayed despite others (chap. 6). Now he prays for others. Here is a prayer to meditate upon. It commenced with worship (v. 4), continued with confession (vv. 5-15), and concluded with supplication (vv. 16-19). Daniel's intercession was on behalf

"And what on earth is KINESIOLOGY?" enquires Clara Clueless. "Is it a new serial?"

Kinesiology, my newspaper announces, is the cure for British sport. Now, I am not greatly interested in that aspect of our national life, but I must confess to an interest in Kinesiology.

Before we go any further I must explain. Kinesiology in action is **Kinesitherapy**, does that help? No? Well, if you want to develop muscles which you have not yet seen, you practice Kinesitherapy and that means you are a Kinesiologist. (Phew! let me mop my brow).

Kinesiology is the science of muscular movement, used in particular as a mode for treating disease. "There is nothing wrong with British sportsmen," continues the newspaper writer, "that Kinesiology won't cure."

We can turn this full beam on to our Easter adventure. There is no limit to our spiritual achievements on Easter Monday, 1957, that a spiritual version of Kinesiology will not enable us to attain.

Elim's life blood is Evangelism, there is no tonic to compare with it. But it means that you must do something about it.

Development of muscles calls for ACTION! Crusader, you are the principal figure in this treatment, although it applies to every Elim member.

Action in prayer, personal evangelism, enthusiastic support. Call upon your muscles to display their latent powers. Take upon yourself a burden for Easter Monday. You must have a burden to effectively pray—there must be an emotional movement within the confines of your own soul.

My mind goes back to a series of very successful rallies conducted in my home town several years ago. People praised the advertising, the planning, the preaching and so on. Of course, they all played their part, especially the highly important ministry of the Word, but we who were "in the know" knew that the secret was to be found in the weekly prayer meetings, and non-stop prayers of the church members, those many weeks before the rallies. They were not pleasant prayers to the hearing; they made you feel uncomfortable. They were soul disturbing to those "at ease in Zion." Prayers which revealed great anguish of soul. Faces soaked in the copious overflow of tears—no glycerine drops for these warriors. This was their battle ground. This was the place where the success of the rallies was assured.

Take upon yourself a burden, Crusader. But, I warn you, it gives no pleasant sensation. It will tear at your heart. It will eat into the vital parts of the secret recesses of your soul, and your only relief will be found in agonising prayer.

That is one mode of spiritual Kinesiology.

Mode two, is personal evangelism.

Now, I am no expert on Kinesiology. As a matter of fact, I must confess that I had never heard of the word before this morning! However, I know that for the muscle to develop and that it may drive out the disease, the muscle must be persuaded to take the strain. In another word—EFFORT.

water, and the blood, and these three agree in one." Reverse this order, for that is how we experience them: The blood—justification; the water—sanctification; the Spirit—empowerment.

There can be no worship or profitable service without constant recourse to the laver (see Exod. 30: 20). When the priests entered the Tabernacle to worship and when they drew near the altar to serve, holiness was the demand. God is seeking a clean people today to worship and serve Him. Will we not learn the wondrous lesson of the laver and be a clean purified people, zealous of good works (Titus 2: 14).
